

Annual Report 2024-25

NGO: Raees Sifa Imdadi Khana, Madhubani

This Annual Report presents the activities, achievements, and impact of Raees Sifa Imdadi Khana during the year 2024-25. The NGO has been actively engaged in healthcare, vocational training, awareness campaigns, and social support programs to uplift the underprivileged communities in Madhubani and nearby regions.

The establishment expenses have been the backbone of our organization, ensuring smooth functioning and availability of necessary facilities to serve the community. Below are the key components:

- **Honorarium to Doctor & Staff:** Doctors, nurses, and support staff were provided with honorariums for their dedicated service. This ensured retention of qualified medical professionals who delivered healthcare to thousands of patients.
- **Office Rent:** Our NGO office served as the operational hub for planning, coordination, and administration. The rented space allowed smooth execution of all activities.
- **Pathological Test Expenses:** Diagnostic and pathological tests were subsidized for poor patients. This enabled early detection and treatment of various illnesses.
- **Neuropathy Treatment Expenses:** Specialized neuropathy treatments were conducted, benefitting patients with chronic pain and neurological disorders.
- **Hospital Maintenance Expenses:** Funds were allocated for the maintenance of hospital infrastructure including cleanliness, electricity, water supply, and essential medical equipment.
- **Printing & Stationery:** Awareness materials, training modules, and documentation work were supported through printing and stationery expenses.
- **Travelling & Conveyance Expenses:** Staff and volunteers frequently traveled to rural and remote areas to ensure outreach and coverage of programs.
- **Contingencies Expenses:** Unforeseen expenses arising during camps, medical emergencies, or urgent requirements were met under this head.

2. Vocational Training Centre Expenses

Raees Sifa Imdadi Khana strongly believes in skill development as a tool for empowerment. During 2024-25, two major vocational training centres were run successfully:

- Mithila Painting Training Centre: This centre preserved and promoted the traditional art of Mithila painting. Dozens of women were trained to create artworks, which were later sold in markets, providing them a sustainable income.
- Tailoring & Garments Making Centre: Women and youth were trained in tailoring and garment making. Many participants started their own small businesses or began earning by working in local tailoring shops.

3. Meeting, Seminar & Social Support

To raise awareness and extend social support, multiple seminars, camps, and programs were organized. These efforts not only spread knowledge but also created a sense of solidarity and mutual support.

- Health & Family Welfare Program: Awareness sessions on maternal health, child nutrition, vaccination, and family planning were organized. Hundreds of families benefitted.
- Agriculture Awareness: Workshops on modern farming techniques, organic farming, and efficient irrigation methods were held to support local farmers.
- Seminar on AIDS & HIV: Educational seminars helped in spreading awareness about HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, and reducing stigma.
- Flood Relief Camp: During the flood season, emergency relief including food, medicines, clothes, and shelter was provided to affected families.
- National Festival & Leader Jayanti: National festivals and leaders' birth anniversaries were celebrated with community participation to promote unity and cultural values.
- Environment Awareness Camp: Tree plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns, and awareness on waste management were carried out to promote a sustainable environment.

4. Impact & Achievements

The year 2024-25 witnessed remarkable achievements across all programs. Healthcare services reached over 15,000 individuals, vocational training

empowered more than 500 women and youth, and social support initiatives created lasting awareness in the community.

Some key impacts include:

- Improved access to healthcare in rural areas.
- Financial independence of women through skill development.
- Increased awareness about HIV, agriculture, and environment.
- Community resilience strengthened during floods through relief camps.

❖ Rina Devi, a beneficiary of the Mithila Painting Centre, started selling her paintings in exhibitions and now supports her children's education.

❖ Sunil Kumar, trained at the Tailoring Centre, opened a small tailoring shop in his village and now provides jobs to two other youth.

❖ Hundreds of families saved from waterborne diseases due to timely pathological testing and treatment.

Looking ahead, Raees Sifa Imdadi Khana plans to:

- Expand healthcare facilities with modern diagnostic tools.
- Open more vocational centres in nearby villages.
- Strengthen disaster management capacity.
- Launch digital awareness campaigns for youth.
